## CONDITIONS OF SALE

1 INSPECTION: No lot is available for inspection by post.
2. EXTENSION: Extensions for expertising will be granted on application. Any purchase made with an extension is payable in full in compliance with Condition 7. Such monies will not be made available to the vendor until the purchaser has received the certificate. The onus shall be on the purchaser to obtain such certificate within a reasonable time, and bear all costs. If the item does not receive a clear certificate, the Auctioneer will refund any expertisation fee not exceeding seventy dollars (\$70).
3. BIDDING
3.1 Bidding, either absentee or in the room, will bind the bidder to these conditions of sale. Subject to any reserve price, the highest bidder shall purchase the lot: any dispute arising as to who is the highest bidder shall be determined by the Auctioneer who may offer the lot again. The Auctioneer may group, split up, or withdraw lots, and transfer bids to identical lots at his discretion.
3.2 The bidder shall be deemed to purchase as buyer unless prior to bidding he has given the Auctioneer a copy of a written authority to bid on behalf of another person.
3.3 Where an agent purchases on behalf of an undisclosed client, such agent shall be personally liable for payment of the purchase money to the Auctioneer and for safe delivery of the lot to the said client.
3.4 Vendor bids shall not be accepted.
4. BIDDING INCREMENTS: Postal bids must comply with the following steps:

Under \$300 - \$10 increases \$1,000-\$2,000 - \$50 increases
\$300-\$500 - \$20 increases \$2,000-\$5,000 - \$100 increases
\$500-\$1,000 - \$25 increases
Otherwise, the regulation of bidding is at the Auctioneer's discretion.
5. ABSENTEE BIDDERS: Bids will be accepted from persons unable to attend the auction, and their bids will be treated in utmost confidence and managed as though the bidder is in the room. The Auctioneer shall not be liable for errors or omissions in executing bids.
Absentee bidders, who have not seen the lots they are buying, may reject any lot with the exception of bulk or mixed lots and collections, where the description is not in accordance with that given in the catalogue. However, any such lots are only returnable within forty-eight (48) hours of receipt, and in the condition received.
6. ESTIMATES: These are conservative. Bidding will commence at a bidding increment over the second highest postal/absentee bid received prior to commencement of the auction. Where one or no bids have been received, bidding will commence at seventy percent ( $70 \%$ ) of the lot estimate, or at reserve if above $70 \%$.
7. PAYMENT: Lots will be at the buyer's risk from the fall of the hammer, but title shall not pass until payment in full has been made of the purchase price (hammer price plus $15 \%$ buyer's premium (plus GST on buyers premium for NZ buyers) and, if applicable, interest). Payment and clearance of lots by room buyers may be carried out on the day of the sale. Payment by postal/absentee bidders must be made upon receipt of invoice. Payments not received within 30 days of auction date will be subject to $2 \%$ penalty interest.
8. No GST is charged on the hammer price, but purchasers outside of New Zealand undertake that neither they or an associated person will cause the goods to be re-imported into New Zealand in substantially the same condition in which they were exported.
9. FAILURE TO PAY: If the buyer breaches Condition 7, the Auctioneer, without prejudice to any other rights available to it, shall be entitled without notice to the buyer to exercise one or more of the following rights and remedies:-
9.1 to terminate the contract with the buyer and any monies which the buyer has paid to the Auctioneer on account of such purchase or purchases shall be forfeited:
9.2 to terminate the contract, resell the lot at any time by public auction and the buyer shall pay to the Auctioneer any resulting deficiency in the purchase price (plus interest) and insurance. Any surplus shall be paid to the vendor;
9.3 to apply any monies at any time due by the Auctioneer to the buyer in payment of the purchase price (plus interest). The Auctioneer shall have a lien over any property of the buyer in the possession of the Auctioneer, in order to secure any monies due to the Auctioneer; and

## Mowbray International Numismatic Auction \#17 11th March 2017

Welcome to Mowbray Collectables' 17th auction. This is a record numismatic auction for both Mowbrays and New Zealand, with a total catalogue value of $\$ 518,435$.
We bring you offerings for all budgets. As a long-time collector before coming to Mowbrays, I always aim to include a range of material that can appeal to all collectors - so again we have both affordable single coins, sets and bulk lots as well as iconic items with estimates up to $\$ 15,000$ for the outstanding Egyptian Pentadrachm of Ptolemy II ( $284-246$ BC) in EF on the front cover. The Ptolemy II Octadrachm is a close second at $\$ 12,000$.

A new feature is a selection of New Zealand PROOF and UNC coins with wholesale opportunities as well as interest to collectors. Several PROOFS featuring the soughtafter number 1 certificate and other low numbers are included, such as the 2009 Icons \$10 gold coin and 2014 Aotearoa North Island and South Island map set of two \$1 coins.

Other rare New Zealand items are the 2007 Scouting $\$ 10$ with just 90 surviving, the 2004 Pukaki gold $\$ 10$, and the 2003 Lord of the Rings three-coin gold $\$ 10$ set. New Zealand gold extends to 38 lots.

Two Waitangi crowns are joined by a good selection of New Zealand errors in both banknotes and coins, 1935 Threepences, two rare UNC 1956 strapless threepences and our best-ever range of Tradesmen's tokens. As well as an 1879 pattern penny in EF, we offer two rare high grade Henry Hall mule halfpennies, with E F Dease and Lipman Levy, and exceptional tokens from T S Forsaith, who was briefly New Zealand Premier and A S Wilson.

The outstanding feature of the auction is the ancient coin sections, ranging from affordable silver and copper, including in bulk, to gold rarities. Rare British Celtic coins, some with long pedigrees, are an exceptional opportunity, including the Dumnocoveros Tigirseno, Iceni and Cunobelinus gold staters. The European ancient coins date back to the dawn of coinage, in the 6th century BC, with coins of Mysia, Alexander the Great, Byzantium, Carthage, Persia, famous Roman leaders and Emperors such as Julius Caesar, Augustus, Tiberius, Nero, Hadrian and others.
There is a broad range of world gold - including our best-ever range of US gold coins - quarter, half, full and double eagles - and even the $\$ 1$ and $\$ 3$ coins. Hammered British gold classics such as the Edward III Noble and Edward IV Rose Noble are joined by French gold extending from John II (1360) to the Salut D'or of Henry VI 1422-1453, Napoleon Bonaparte and twentieth century republican issues. Spanish Doubloon types will appeal those who appreciate legendary material while the Australian Prince Leonard of Hutt and American Samoan coins add fun and rarity to the catalogue. Modern world gold as well as other British hammered, guinea, sovereign and modern gold provide extensive numismatic and bullion opportunities.

There is no doubt about the cutest medal - it has to be the corgi in the 1972 Royal Silver Wedding 6 gold medal set. Great leaders and deeds can be found in the Commemorative medals - Captain James Cook in the 1779 dated Royal Society, L Pingo, silver commemorative medal and Oliver Cromwell after his rehabilitation in the eighteenth century.
The 21 Military Medals and groups represent an increase in quality and quantity, with significant medals including the 1944 DFC, Military Cross of World War I, the Punjab Medal of 1849 to John Walsh, and the Colonial Auxiliary Forces group of three to NZ Hon Lieutenant Sydney Spencer George. Some strike a somber note with several awarded to those killed in action. Especially significant to New Zealand is the Indian Mutiny Medal of 1857/8 to Patrick Gammie, surgeon with the 80th Staffordshire regiment that came to New Zealand in 1840 with first Governor William Hobson, acquired by the vendor in Taumarunui in the early 1960's. A notable feature is the QSM, gold and other medals awarded to Champion New Zealand Piper Frank MacKinnon, Pipe Major and President of the City of Wellington Pipe Band. Other Honours recognize British achievement, including OBE and MBE groups.
Banknotes end the catalogue with mainly scarcer, earlier World banknotes and excitement in New Zealand errors, an unusual Fiji $\$ 5$ error group with duplicated serials and bank notes from almost all New Zealand's active 1930's trading bank issuers. There are scarcer Reserve Bank issues - such as $1992 \$ 100$ note uncut blocks.

My warm thanks to all who have contributed to this catalogue and sale. I particularly want to thank our vendors who have contributed to our strong growth over the last 18 months and our team, including Nicola Bowden, Jared Thornton, Maree Malin, Keren Malin, Lyndell Fitzgibbon, Jan McDonald, Paul Stark and John Mowbray.
